

Jobs Originated through Launching Travel (JOLT) Act of 2019

Congressional Bill Numbers: H.R. 2187; there is no bill in the Senate.

Status as of February 2020: No action since Exhibitions Day 2019.

Why this matters to you:

- The JOLT Act will update and strengthen numerous programs related to the efficiency and volume of international inbound travel and help the U.S. regain share of the global travel market.
- Renaming the Visa Waiver Program to Secure Travel Partnership more accurately reflects the true meaning of this security program, making it less subject to political attack.
- Making it easier for international buyers or exhibitors to enter the country helps expands the shows marketplace
- Less staff time dealing with international buyers and visitors travel needs.

Overview: In 2019, the House introduced H.R. 2187, to amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to stimulate international travel to the United States, and for other purposes. The JOLT Act provides flexibility to the Secretary of Homeland Security to admit new countries to the currently named Visa Waiver Program. It also renames the Visa Waiver Program to Secure Travel Partnership.

Our Message: The JOLT Act will update and strengthen numerous programs related to the efficiency and volume of international inbound travel and help the U.S. regain share of the global travel market.
